Important BV Museum Summer Camp Information

(Please retain this section!)

Cancellations

- Once registered, cancellations must be made in writing (email) by July 21, 2025, two-weeks prior to the first day of camp (August 5, 2025). Cancellations must be confirmed with museum staff via writing (email). Refunds will not be given with less than seven days' notice.
 - o No refunds will be given for absences due to illness.
 - No refunds will be given if your child is asked not to return to camp due to behaviors that are continually disruptive, violent, abusive, bullying etc.
- ➤ If the museum has to cancel the camp because of low enrollment, you will be notified by July 29th, 2025, and your camp fee will be reimbursed to you in full via cheque.

Arrival Policy:

- > Drop off at the Old Church (3704 First Avenue) between **8:25 am and 9:00 am.** No early arrivals please!
- > Campers must be signed in each day by a guardian
- If the camper arrives late and the group is not at the Old Church (e.g. group is walking to a local park) they must be taken to the group by their parent/guardian. If this is the case, either staff in the museum will be able to provide information on where the group has gone, or there will be a sign on the OC door.

When possible, please note your late arrival by contacting the BV Museum, or in advance

Departure Policy:

- Camp concludes each day at 4:30pm.
- All campers must be signed out by the legal guardian
 - o BVM staff must be told in advance (e.g. during drop-off, or by calling the museum office) if someone other than the legal guardian (e.g. aunt, family friend, grandparent) is signing out the child.

Contacting your child:

If you need to get a message to your child or the camp staff during the day, call the Museum office at 250-847-5322.

^{*}A late pickup fee of \$10 per 15 minutes will be charged starting at 4:40pm*

The use of cell phones during camp is not permitted. Campers who need to have a phone on site for special situations can leave their phone with the camp staff.

Inform the BV Museum if:

- Information on your registration form has changed.
- Someone other than those listed on the registration form is dropping off or picking up your camper.
- A camper will be arriving late to camp or will not be attending camp (due to illness, etc.)
- A change occurs in your child's life that alters their attitude, behaviour or causes emotional upset.

Parents will be contacted immediately if:

- Your child has received an injury that may require immediate medical attention.
- Your child exhibits a medical condition that may be contagious or threatening to others.
- Your child is ill and unable to participate in the daily activities.
- Your child exhibits a pattern of disruptive behaviour that interferes with the programming or other children.

Parents will be notified at pickup time if:

- Your child has a minor injury that did not require a medical professional.
- Your child complains of non-emergency conditions or symptoms.
- Your child exhibits unusual or unacceptable behaviour.
- The BV Museum wants to share your child's accomplishments with you.

Lunch/Food:

- Campers must bring their own nut-free lunches and snacks
- Please ensure that your child(ren) have enough food for at least three healthy snacks and a lunch.
 Remember that a day at the BV Museum camp is slightly longer than a day at school.
- Please ensure your child(ren) have enough fluids and a refillable water bottle to continue to hydrate throughout the day. Tap water is available to refill bottles.
- > Campers are not permitted to leave the Museum to purchase lunch, snacks, etc. unless signed out by their guardian at lunch time.

Toys, Sports Equipment:

Toys (including electronic games, music players, trading cards, etc.) or other personal items are not allowed at the camp. The BV Museum is not responsible for broken, lost or stolen items.

> If the staff request a specific item for an activity, a note will be sent home, and the equipment will be kept in a safe place until needed.

Photos:

The BV Museum may take photographs of campers throughout the day to be used in promoting programs at the BV Museum, in print or on the BV Museum's website. Please ensure you have checked the appropriate box on the registration form if you do not want photos taken.

Clothing/Camp Supplies

- Some camp activities will be messy (e.g. paint) or involve physical activity. Campers should wear comfortable clothing and closed-toe shoes. **Packing a change of clothes is highly recommended**, in case they get wet from time outdoors, spill, etc.
- Campers will be spending time outside every day, please ensure your child(ren) bring a refillable water bottle.
- Please send your child to camp wearing sunblock with an additional bottle for reapplication. Ensure that they have a hat, sweater, or rain jacket, as the weather of the day requires.
- Camp Leaders will make every effort to be sure campers do not lose items. However, the BV Museum does not assume responsibility for anything lost.

The BV Museum is not responsible for providing extra clothing, sunscreen, snacks, beverages, or lunch

Illness/Injury

- If your child is ill, please do not send them to camp. The BV Museum does not have provisions for giving nursing care other than basic First Aid. Should a child come to camp and become ill, parents will be notified and asked to pick up their child.
- In the event of an emergency, the BV Museum will call an ambulance to transport your child to the hospital for treatment, and you will be contacted immediately.
- In case of contagious disease, please notify Camp Staff immediately. All parents will be notified as soon as possible.
- The BV Museum will not give refunds for any camp time missed due to illness.

Medications

- In the interest of your child's safety, it is vital that you inform Camp Staff (in writing) of allergies or any other medical conditions that will impact your child's welfare.
- If your child's medical status changes prior to the start of camp, please inform the BV Museum.
